



Coggeshall Ward



Introduction

This profile explores the demographic, social and economic characteristics of Coggeshall Ward and is largely based on data drawn from the 2011 Census. 2001 Census data has also been used to provide comparisons in the Ward over time for some of the characteristics. This profile is a snapshot, and is intended to support an understanding of Braintree District's Ward characteristics.

These Ward profiles represent the new Ward boundaries introduced in the Braintree District by the Electoral Commission from May 2015. This has meant that it has not been possible to directly source data from the 2011 Census for these new Wards, as they didn't exist when the Census was completed. Data for the rural Wards has been produced by adding up the Census data at a Parish level to make up the new Ward areas.

About Coggeshall Ward

The Coggeshall Ward is a rural Ward located in the South East of the Braintree District and contains the Stisted, Bradwell and Coggeshall Parishes. Following the redrawing of the Ward boundaries, Coggeshall Ward was expanded to include the Parishes of Bradwell and Stisted, whilst the boundary now no longer includes Feering Parish.

Development Sites

The development plan sets out what, where, when, and how development will be managed in the District for the next 15 years.

Whilst the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) sets out the presumption in favour of sustainable development, planning law requires that applications for planning permission must be determined in accordance with the development plan unless material considerations indicate otherwise. The NPPF does not change the statutory status of the development plan as the starting point for decision making.

The current Braintree District development plan is made up of a number of documents, including the Local Plan Review 2005 and the Core Strategy 2011.

The maps show the allocations for homes, employment, open space etc. Proposals Map 67 covers the whole of the District and defines Inset Areas. There is an Inset map (numbers 1 to 66) for each town or village with a defined development boundary, within which development is generally acceptable subject to the policies in the Plan. Areas outside of the development boundaries are classified as countryside where development is restricted to uses appropriate to the countryside.

The Core Strategy is accompanied by the <u>LDF Proposals Map</u>, which replaces the Local Plan Review Proposals Map (67). Growth locations are shown on Insets <u>1a Land to the north-west of Braintree - off Panfield Lane</u>, <u>1b Land to the west of the A131 at Great Notley</u>, <u>2a Land to the north-east of Witham (in Rivenhall Parish) - off Forest Road</u>, and <u>2b Land to the south-west of Witham - off Hatfield Road</u>. These are set out in the Core Strategy and replace those areas of Insets 1 and 2 in the Local Plan Review which they cover.

The Pre Submission Site Allocations & Development Management Plan as amended by Further Changes (ADMP) was adopted at Full Council on 15th September 2014, as a material consideration in accordance with the Interim Planning Policy Statement. The ADMP also includes a Proposals Map and Inset Maps. The non-strategic sites and policies which are contained in the Pre Submission ADMP will be carried over into the new Local Plan unless new evidence or further changes in government policy require changes to be made.

An Annual Monitoring Report sets out the principal characteristics of the District, assesses progress in preparing Local Development Documents and monitors progress in housing, employment and other development. Work has begun on a new Local Plan for the period up to 2033, as a result of new research that indicated that the ADMP would not allocate sufficient sites to meet the District's development needs. See the below link for further details.

This was an opportunity for developers, landowners and other interested parties to put forward to the Council sites for development within Braintree District that they believe are suitable for development for homes, jobs or other uses. The site suggestions received by us will be used to begin the preparation of the new Local Plan. Sites in red are those that have been submitted to the council for consideration. Please note that no assessment by officers has been carried out as to the extent or suitability of these sites for development, and no decision has been made on whether they will be allocated for development in the new Local Plan.

The Coggeshall Ward resident population is 4% of the total Braintree District population of 147,084 (Census 2011).





The population in Coggeshall Ward has increased by 8% since the last Census. This is lower than the rate of population growth in the District overall but at a slightly higher rate than the population growth of Essex as a whole.

The Ward has a significantly higher proportion of its residents aged over 60 compared to the levels seen in Essex and the Braintree District overall according to the 2011 Census.


Health

Life Expectancy

There was no Census 2011 data on resident's life expectancy at a Parish level that would have enabled figures for the new rural Ward boundaries to be produced. Census 2011 life expectancy data was instead found for the whole of the Braintree rural area. The Braintree rural area consists of the following Parishes, Finchingfield, Coggeshall, Wethersfield, Great Bardfield, Bardfield Saling, Shalford, Panfield, Great Saling, Rayne, Great Notley, Stisted, Cressing, Bradwell, Rivenhall, Silver End, Kelvedon and Feering.



The average life expectancy for males and females in the Braintree Rural Area was higher on average than the Braintree District and the East of England region as a whole.



Coggeshall Ward saw a fall in the proportion of people who identified themselves as "White British" by 0.7 percentage points in the 2011 Census compared to 2001. The fall in this proportion is less than that seen at a District and County level.



A significantly higher proportion of residents in Coggeshall Ward describe themselves as Christian than the District and County levels when looking at the 2011 Census data. The number of residents in the Ward who described themselves as having "No religion" almost doubled over the period.



The proportion of residents in Coggeshall Ward who hold a "Level 4 qualification and above" is much higher than the proportion of residents who hold this level of qualification at a District or County level. There are also a smaller proportion of residents within the Ward that hold "no qualifications" compared to the proportion of residents who hold this highest level of qualification in the other compared areas.






The above chart shows that according to the Census 2011 data the proportions of residents in a particular housing tenure are very similar to the District and County proportions.








